We had a beautiful room looking across the river at the lights of all the high rise buildings. Whilst there we went to the bike show on the Saturday at the Excel centre, and then did lots of sightseeing on the Sunday including Madam Tussauds, and ending in Trafalgar Square to see the end of the celebrations for the Chinese New Year. **Police Visit**

I accompanied Paul our Sec. to a meeting with C/I Inspector Andy Charlton at Riverside HQ last Wednesday lunch time. We were there to discuss how we (NAM) were going to fit into their plans for 2011. They have around £2000 they wish to give us for carrying out 100 free ride checks with the people (bikers) they stop during the month of March. **New Government plans**

Whilst there we were told of a new plan that was starting very soon, he told us that the government were going to allow various registers to work together and I think that this is going to cause quite a lot of controversy in the first year.

The new rule is that if you have your vehicle (car, van, bike etc) taxed but not insured even if it is off the road or even garaged for a while, it must be insured or you will get a warning and then a fixed penalty notice.

So if you take your vehicle off the road for a period of time, as you can't afford to insure it, or maybe you're not going to ride it for a while over winter, you must register it as SORN, and it must be insured all the time or you will get a fine!

I do hope that the observers are going to do us proud again this year with their support.

We have been able to get invited into E.on (a utilities provider) to offer their employees a free assessment with the potential of joining our group for more training. So far we have 27 people interested in the day. I have been Vice Chairman to the council forum meetings for 3yrs now, promoting safer riding and the IAM. But recently my working constraints have not allowed me to attend a couple of the meetings, which I hope to put right this year.

I have been made Vice Chairman of region 7 where we are trying to spread our group's standards amongst other groups in our region, to assist them in becoming better.

I am one of twenty eight people who have been asked to be on the NRG committee of the IAM. We have been working on ideas for two years now, where we are looking at new ways to improve the experience of the members and to improve the way we train them.

All these meetings and events supporting the group have involved over 160hrs of personal time.

I have also been busy observing numerous associates and trainee observers to the tune of over 160hrs this year as well. And all this adds up to the equivalent of 8 weeks work, on top of running my own business.

I have offered my services to the group now 12 times, I hope that you agree that I have served you well and brought the group respect from its peers?

I still wish to continue serving you as your chairman, as I get a great amount of enjoyment and pleasure from the position. If you feel that I am worthy of that role for another year, then please join me at the AGM and place your votes in my corner.

A very busy March is ahead of us as indicated in our Chairman's column. There are two Police operations running in March.

1. Operation Retina – Static stop / check on motorcycles – in the past NAM have been involved with the Police on this Operation, this has been a very good source of 'candidates' for our Ride Safe Event and the Skills For Life package.
2. The Police Operation Gemstone 4 -Aimed at the 'commuter biker' The Police identified that 5 out of the 6 biker fatalities on Nottinghamshire roads last year were commuting when they had their accident! Naturally they want to target that section! The Police will identify areas of Nottinghamshire to be patrolled for these 'commuter bikers' these bikes will be stopped, checked for legality (*must be stressed that the police's main aim is not to prosecute*) and if they meet the criteria as a commuter biker the police will invite them to consider a free rider check with the IAM, if the biker agrees the rider will be handed over to us, in the patrol car will be a NAM Observer, the biker will be handed over to the Observer who will take his / her contact details and explain what the rider will get on the 'Free rider check' then at a later date the rider will have their free rider check with us! Hopefully at the very least we will be able to pass on our considerable skills and make that rider much safer! Of course they may want to take up the Skills for Life package – result!

April is also busy with our NRS day on the 10<sup>th</sup>!

So we will be asking for your help very soon! Please don't be shy, the NRS is a great day and the Retina's are very informative, the Police do come over in a very positive way on Retina believe me! All in all we will be very busy in the next couple of months so we all need to be focused and pulling together!

#### 2. Minutes of last AGM:

Were last published in Jan 2009 Newsletter as AGM moved to March 2010 and have been deemed Accurate with no matters arising.

#### 3. Reports:

Chairman; Reported on the progress of the National Regional Groups Committee which is made up of representatives from IAM groups, and they are discussing and gaining feedback on how to take the IAM forward as a professional body. He talked about how we are strengthening our links with the Notts Police Force by attending and supporting their Operation Retina Campaign, our commitment to working with local companies to promote the IAM and that we have recently attended 2 open weekends CMC and Powersports where we took their customers on accompanied test rides. Steve also thanked those on the committee who this year are stepping down – Craig Garland, Duncan Wallace, Phil Meynell and Andy Hampshire and also to John Annable who over the last year has stepped down from his position as Chief Observer and has taken over a new position of organising group ride outs and social events.

Secretary; Reported on the new IAM website and that the IAM now has a new Cycling division.

Treasurer; Please see separate accounts sheet, it is to be noted that these figures go from Nov 2008.

Associate Coordinator; Jan to Dec 2009 we still had 35 associates in training, with approximately 27 passes during the year. In total we trained 67 associates and now carry 27 active associates into the New Year with 8 more on hold, 2 leavers and 5 passes since 1st Jan 2010.

Chief Observer; Informed the group about the new Observer mentoring system which has a new yearly plan for Observers which will be adhered to. We now have 8 new Trainee Observers which is the most we have had at any one time for quite a while. Observer training is being handled by Ian Orgill.

Newsletter; Phil thanked everyone for their input over his term in office and handed the reins to the new editor Tony Bell.

#### 4. Honorary Members;

It was with great pleasure that the group officially recognised the contribution that Angela Laughton has made to the group over the last 14 years by making her an Honorary group member. Angela has become the face of NAM to over the last decade attending group nights, ride outs, open days (to name a few) and showing great hospitality (as well as an alternative point of view) to the committee when they meet at her house to discuss group activities. She has worked tirelessly with the group both front of house (for which she is most well known) and also behind the scenes (which many do not see) as she helps to plan, organise and run group events. ## New Observers wanted!!

Dear Members

At this time each year the club invites members to apply to be trained to carry out the role of an Observer.

This invitation extends to all members who have passed the Advanced Test. We have places for 4 new trainee Observers.

There are huge benefits to becoming an Observer. It is an opportunity to mentor and advise others to prepare them for the Advanced Test. An Observer gains a great deal of satisfaction in knowing that they are improving the riding standard of others.

Also, by becoming an Observer, you will learn much more, not just about helping other riders reach the standard you have achieved, but through a greater understanding of the principles and application of advanced riding techniques, this will help you maintain and improve your own standards of riding.

The club has a very experienced Observer training team who will provide expert coaching in all aspects of observing.

There is a selection process which assesses a candidate's ability to keep up with an associate on an observed run and their communication skills.

This process involves the candidate following an observer for about 20 miles. The Observer will ride within the speed limit and display a few basic faults. The candidate should then identify these faults, discuss them and then give a good standard demonstration ride (this does **not** require use of a radio or commentary). Please do not be put off thinking that this is a difficult start. We appreciate that candidates will not be experts but we have to ensure that the basic skills required to be an Observer are in place. The whole process is therefore a fairly gentle one.

The Trainee Observer Assessment Day will take place, weather permitting, on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> March 2011.

For the successful applicants the Observer training course consists of about six practical sessions and a video session run at weekends where the Trainee Observers work in pairs with the training team. This allows them to hopefully complete by the start of the block course where they can take real associates on training runs. The training takes place at weekends and requires a high level of commitment for a few weeks to get the course completed in time. This is important because of the pairing of the observers. The training has to be carried out as a group of two Trainees and one Senior, if one person cannot attend a particular session the others cannot carry on with it. Please bear in mind that this is only during the initial training period.

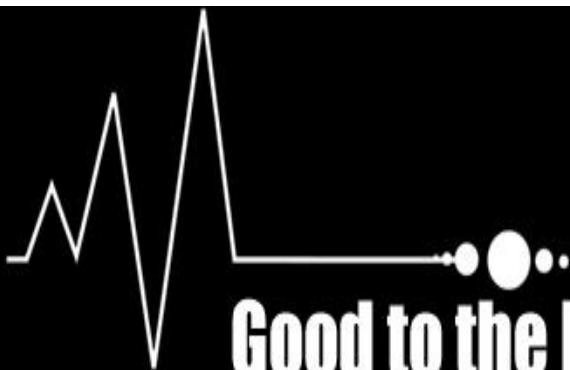

## A message from Head Office.

Dear all,

We recently received the following email from Spinal Research, and wondered if you would be interested in taking part, or at least finding out more. If so, please could you drop Caroline an email at [caroline.holmes@iam.org.uk](mailto:caroline.holmes@iam.org.uk), and she will pass your details on to Isabel at the charity.

'Unfortunately over 800 people a year are paralysed in the UK and too many were riding a motorcycle when they were hurt. Sadly, paralysis doesn't only mean not being able to walk again - depending on the part of the spinal cord that's injured it can cause loss of movement in arms and hands, an inability to breathe on your own and a total lack of independence. Recently there have been major breakthroughs in our research, resulting in treatments that are moving into clinical trials and this is a huge step forward. But our research is not cheap – a one year project alone costs around £50,000 and with no government funding we rely on our supporters to help.

Last year I launched the Fight Back appeal, which was fronted by our supporter Dave Webb, who was paralysed when he was just 19. The appeal was supported by top racers, including James Toseland and Neil Hodgson as well as TV presenter Suzi Perry. The appeal is continuing this year and Guy Martin has agreed to put his support behind a nationwide fundraising event called the Big Brew. We are asking motorcycle clubs, dealerships and individuals to organise a tea morning/day in aid of Ride Out and the group that raises the most money will meet Guy at a test session or race meeting and everyone that takes part can also win the same. It would be wonderful if your IAM groups would like to get involved with this event as it would be a great way to raise the profile of local groups as well as helping to raise funds for a cause close to motorcyclists hearts. The appeal will be launched at MCN's Motorcycle Show in February.

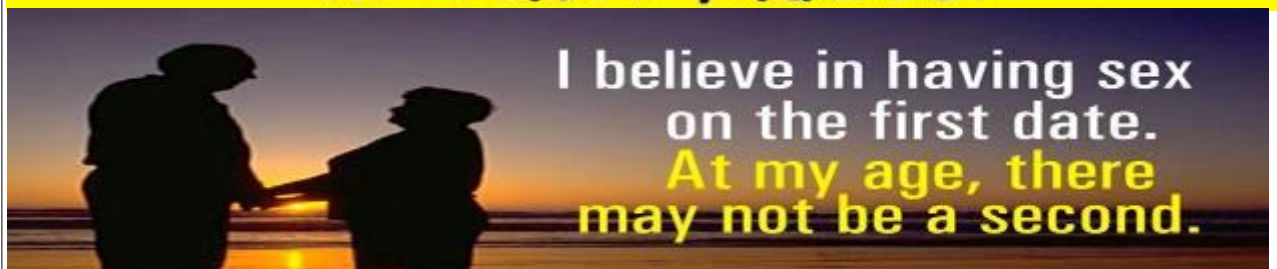
